EXPLANATIONS FOR EVERY TENSE RULE

Covers all twelve tenses — present, past, and future in their simple, continuous, perfect, and perfect continuous forms — with the correct sentence and a clear rule for each.

1*Choose the grammatically correct sentence.*

A	✓ He sings.
B	He does sings.
C	He did sings.
D	He do sings.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) He sings.

Present simple with third-person singular subjects (he, she, it) adds -s/-es to the verb and uses no helping verb in affirmative sentences, so "He sings" is correct.

2*Choose the grammatically correct sentence.*

A	He do not go to school.
B	He does goes to school.
C	He does not goes to school.
D	✓ He does not go to school.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: D) He does not go to school.

Present simple negative with a third-person singular subject uses "does not" followed by the base verb, so "does not go" is correct.

3*Choose the grammatically correct sentence.*

A	✓ They do not hang out.
B	They does not hang out.
C	They does not hangs out.
D	They do not hangs out.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) They do not hang out.

Present simple negative with a plural subject like "they" uses "do not" followed by the base verb, so "do not hang out" is correct.

4*Choose the grammatically correct sentence.*

A	This do not mean that I am wrong.
B	✓ This does not mean that I am wrong.
C	This mean that I am wrong.
D	This means that I do am wrong.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) This does not mean that I am wrong.

"This" is treated as third-person singular, so the negative form takes "does not" plus the base verb: "does not mean."

5

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	The baby is sleeps in his mother's lap.
B	The baby are sleep in his mother's lap.
C	✓ The baby is sleeping in his mother's lap.
D	The baby is slept in his mother's lap.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: C) The baby is sleeping in his mother's lap.

Present continuous, for something happening right now, uses *is/am/are + verb-ing*. With the singular subject "baby," that is "is sleeping."

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	✓ He is going to play football after the school.
B	He are going to play football after the school.
C	He is not go to play football after the school.
D	He is not goes to play football after the school.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) He is going to play football after the school.

A near-future plan uses *"is/am/are going to" + base verb*. With third-person singular "he," the correct helping verb is "is," giving "is going to play."

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	Are you goes to dinner?
B	✓ Are you going out for dinner?
C	Are you go out for dinner?
D	Is you going out for dinner?

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) Are you going out for dinner?

Present continuous questions invert the helping verb and subject; with "you" the helping verb is "are," giving "Are you going...?"

8

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	✓ I am talking too much.
B	I am talk too much.
C	I are talking too much.
D	I am will be talking too much.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) I am talking too much.

Present continuous with the subject "I" uses "am" + verb-ing, so "am talking" is correct.

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	She have lived in this house all her life.
B	✓ She has lived in this house all her life.
C	She have live in this house all her life.
D	She have live in this house all her life.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) She has lived in this house all her life.

Present perfect tense needs *has/have* + *past participle*. With the *third-person singular* subject “*she*,” the helping verb is “*has*,” giving “*has lived*.”

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	You has had a beautiful past.
B	You has a beautiful past.
C	✓ You have had a beautiful past.
D	You have live a beautiful past.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: C) You have had a beautiful past.

Present perfect with “*you*” uses “*have*” + *past participle*, so “*have had*” is correct.

11*Choose the grammatically correct sentence.*

A	✓ I have not written this article.
B	I has not written this article.
C	I have not wrote this article.
D	I has not wrote this article.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) I have not written this article.

Present perfect negative with "I" uses "have not" + past participle, so "have not written" is correct ("written" is the past participle, not "wrote").

12*Choose the grammatically correct sentence.*

A	Have he finished his homework?
B	✓ Has he finished his homework?
C	Has he finish his homework?
D	Has he finish his homework?

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) Has he finished his homework?

Present perfect questions invert has/have and the subject; with "he" the helping verb is "has," and the main verb stays as the past participle "finished."

13

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	I has been writing this book for one year.
B	I have been write this book for one year.
C	✓ I have been writing this book for one year.
D	I have been wrote this book for one year.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: C) I have been writing this book for one year.*Present perfect continuous needs has/have been + verb-ing. With "I," that is "have been writing."*

14

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	✓ I have not been sleeping for many days because of the hectic routine.
B	I has no been sleeping for many days because of the hectic routine.
C	I am not been sleeping for many days because of the hectic routine.
D	I have not sleeping for man days because of the hectic routine.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) I have not been sleeping for many days because of the hectic routine.*Present perfect continuous negative with "I" uses "have not been" + verb-ing, so "have not been sleeping" is correct.*

15*Choose the grammatically correct sentence.*

A	Has you ever been to this restaurant?
B	Has you ever to this restaurant?
C	✓ Have you ever been to this restaurant?
D	Has you been to a restaurant?

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: C) Have you ever been to this restaurant?

Present perfect continuous/perfect questions with “you” use “Have” as the helping verb, giving “Have you ever been...?”

16*Choose the grammatically correct sentence.*

A	✓ He has been ill for a week.
B	He have been ill for a week.
C	He have ill for a week.
D	He has ill for a week.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) He has been ill for a week.

With the third-person singular subject “he,” present perfect (continuous) constructions take “has,” giving “has been ill.”

17 Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	You have qualify the exam.
B	✓ You qualified the exam.
C	You did qualified the exam.
D	You did qualify the exam.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) You qualified the exam.

Past simple affirmative sentences use the simple past form of the verb directly, without "did," so "qualified" alone is correct.

18 Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	✓ He did not come to this room.
B	He did not came to this room.
C	He did not coming to this room.
D	He has not come to this room.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) He did not come to this room.

Past simple negative uses "did not" + base verb, so "did not come" is correct (not the past or -ing form).

19 Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	Did she called?
B	✓ Did she call?
C	Did she has called?
D	Did she has call?

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) Did she call?

Past simple questions use "did" + base verb, so "Did she call?" is correct.

20 Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	✓ She did not go to shopping.
B	She did go for shopping.
C	She did went to shopping.
D	She did not went to shopping.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) She did not go to shopping.

Past simple negative uses "did not" + base verb, so "did not go" is correct, not the past form "went."

21 Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	She were preparing for the presentation.
B	✓ She was preparing for the presentation.
C	she were prepared for the presentation.
D	She was been prepare for the presentation.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) She was preparing for the presentation.

Past continuous with the singular subject "she" uses "was" + verb-ing, so "was preparing" is correct.

22 Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	✓ They were working together.
B	They was working together.
C	They were work together.
D	They was work together.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) They were working together.

Past continuous with the plural subject "they" uses "were" + verb-ing, so "were working" is correct.

23 Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	Ali were sleeping when Sara entered the room.
B	✓ Ali was sleeping when Sara entered the room.
C	Ali was slept when Sara entered the room.
D	Ali were slept when Sara entered the room.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) Ali was sleeping when Sara entered the room.

Past continuous with the singular subject "Ali" uses "was" + verb-ing, so "was sleeping" is correct.

24 Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	✓ The lizard was not running toward you.
B	The lizard were not running toward you.
C	The lizard was not ran toward you.
D	The lizard was not ran towards you.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) The lizard was not running toward you.

Past continuous negative with the singular subject "the lizard" uses "was not" + verb-ing, so "was not running" is correct.

25

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	He worked very hard to earn this position.
B	He had work very hard to earn this position.
C	He has work very hard to earn this position.
D	✓ He had worked very hard to earn this position.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: D) He had worked very hard to earn this position.

Past perfect tense, for an action completed before another point in the past, uses "had" + past participle, so "had worked" is correct.

26

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	Ali had gone before Sameer reach.
B	Ali had went before Sameer reach.
C	✓ Ali had gone before Sameer reached.
D	Ali had went before Sameer reached.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: C) Ali had gone before Sameer reached.

The earlier of two past actions takes past perfect ("had gone"), while the later action stays in simple past ("reached").

27

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	✓ Had you thought about your future?
B	Had you think about your future?
C	Has you thought about your future?
D	Have you think about your future?

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) Had you thought about your future?

Past perfect questions invert "had" and the subject, keeping the main verb as a past participle, so "Had you thought...?" is correct.

28

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	I had not tell him the truth.
B	I has not tell him the truth.
C	✓ I had not told him the truth.
D	I have not tell him the truth.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: C) I had not told him the truth.

Past perfect negative with "I" uses "had not" + past participle, so "had not told" is correct.

29

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	✓ I had been applying for a job since November.
B	I had been applied for this job since November.
C	I had been apply for this job since November.
D	I had applying for this job since November.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) I had been applying for a job since November.

Past perfect continuous, for an action that started in the past and continued, uses "had been" + verb-ing, so "had been applying" is correct.

30

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	Kids has not eating healthy for a month.
B	✓ Kids had not been eating healthy for a month.
C	Kids had not eating healthy for a month.
D	Kids have not been ate healthy for a month.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) Kids had not been eating healthy for a month.

Past perfect continuous negative uses "had not been" + verb-ing, so "had not been eating" is correct.

31

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	✓ Had the kids been doing their homework?
B	Had the kids been done their homework?
C	Have the kids doing their homework?
D	Has the kids doing their homework?

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) Had the kids been doing their homework?

Past perfect continuous questions invert "had" and the subject, keeping "been" + verb-ing, so "Had the kids been doing..." is correct.

32

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	I had working on this project since July.
B	I has working on this project since July.
C	✓ I had been working on this project since July.
D	I had been worked on this project since July.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: C) I had been working on this project since July.

Past perfect continuous with "I" uses "had been" + verb-ing, so "had been working" is correct.

33*Choose the grammatically correct sentence.*

A	I shall bought her a nice car.
B	✓ I shall buy her a nice car.
C	I shall brought her a nice car.
D	I shall took her her nice car.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) I shall buy her a nice car.

Future simple tense uses will/shall + the base form of the verb, so "shall buy" is correct, not the past forms "bought" or "brought."

34*Choose the grammatically correct sentence.*

A	✓ She will not sing a song here.
B	She will not sang a song here.
C	She will not sung a song here.
D	She shall not sung a song here.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) She will not sing a song here.

Future simple negative uses "will not" + base verb, so "will not sing" is correct.

35*Choose the grammatically correct sentence.*

A	Will he started a new business?
B	✓ Will he start a new business?
C	shall he started a new business?
D	Shall he be start a new business?

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) Will he start a new business?

Future simple questions invert “will” and the subject, keeping the base verb, so “Will he start...?” is correct.

36*Choose the grammatically correct sentence.*

A	Will you brought some chocolates for me?
B	Will you bought some chocolates for me?
C	✓ Will you bring some chocolates for me?
D	Shall you brought some chocolates for me?

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: C) Will you bring some chocolates for me?

Future simple questions keep the base verb after “will,” so “Will you bring...?” is correct, not the past form “brought.”

A	✓ He will be feeling better tomorrow.
B	He will be feel better tomorrow.
C	He will be felt better tomorrow.
D	He shall be feel better tomorrow.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) He will be feeling better tomorrow.

Future continuous, for an ongoing state or action at a future point, uses will be + verb-ing, so “will be feeling” is correct.

38 Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	He will be came here for the preparations.
B	✓ He will be coming here for the preparations.
C	He will be come here for the preparations.
D	He will coming here for the preparations.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) He will be coming here for the preparations.

Future continuous uses will be + verb-ing, so “will be coming” is correct.

A	✓ She will not be enjoying with you.
B	She will not be enjoy with you.
C	She will not enjoying with you.
D	She will not be enjoyed with you.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) She will not be enjoying with you.

Future continuous negative uses will not be + verb-ing, so “will not be enjoying” is correct.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) Will you be taking this exam?*Future continuous questions use Will + subject + be + verb-ing, so "Will you be taking...?" is correct.*

A	He will have took the test.
B	He will has taken this exam.
C	✓ He will have taken this exam.
D	He will had taken this exam.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: C) He will have taken this exam.*Future perfect tense, for an action completed before a future point, uses will have + past participle, so "will have taken" is correct.*

A	✓ We shall have gone to the office.
B	We shall has went to the office.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) We shall have gone to the office.

Future perfect with "we" uses shall have + past participle, so "shall have gone" is correct.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: C) Will he have written an article?

Future perfect questions use Will + subject + have + past participle, so "Will he have written...?" is correct.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) You will have completed your task.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) They will have been sleeping for two hours.

Future perfect continuous, for an ongoing action up to a future point, uses will have been + verb-ing, so "will have been sleeping" is correct.

B	Will he has been date her for five years?

D	Will he be date her for five years?

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) Will he have been dating her for five years?

Future perfect continuous questions use Will + subject + have been + verb-ing, so "Will he have been dating...?" is correct.

A	She will not has been washed dishes for the dinner.
B	✓ She will not have been washing dishes for the dinner.
C	She will not have been wash dishes for the dinner.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: B) She will not have been washing dishes for the dinner.

Future perfect continuous negative uses will not have been + verb-ing, so “will not have been washing” is correct.

B	She were hosting a lot of parties.

D	She was hosted a lot of parties.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) She was hosting a lot of parties.*Past continuous with the singular subject "she" uses "was" + verb-ing, so "was hosting" is correct.*

Choose the grammatically correct sentence.

A	✓ They do not work.
B	They do not worked.
C	They does not worked.
D	They does not have worked.

EXPLANATION | Correct Answer: A) They do not work.*Present simple negative with the plural subject "they" uses "do not" + base verb, so "do not work" is correct.*
