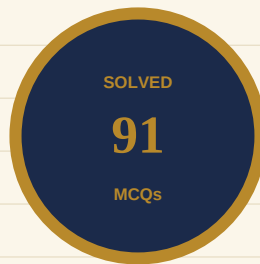

Every question from the original model paper is reproduced in full and answered against independently verified sources. Three items where the source paper's own printed options do not match the correct value are clearly flagged rather than silently "corrected."

HOW THIS ANSWER KEY WORKS

Every one of the 91 numbered questions from the original “Model Paper 220” booklet is reproduced below exactly as printed, one MCQ per section, in its original order. (Note: the source booklet's own numbering skips from Question 84 straight to Question 86 — there is no Question 85 in the original document, so none has been invented here.)

The correct option for each question has been independently checked against reliable reference sources and is marked with a green tick and a shaded background. A short explanation follows every question to reinforce the underlying concept — useful both for solving similar MCQs and for quick revision before the exam.

A note on three questions: For Q5, Q21 and Q29, careful verification shows that the value the source booklet itself computes (or the real-world fact) does not appear among its own four printed options. Rather than force-fitting an incorrect tick onto one of the choices, these three are marked with an amber “Source-Paper Note” box that explains the discrepancy and states the true answer.
